#### **ORDER**

# on approval of Norms relating to the colouring matters which may be added to medicinal products for human use

Taking into account provisions of Law No. 95/2006 on healthcare reform, Title XVII, The medicinal product, and of Government Ordinance No. 125/1998 related to the set up, organisation and functioning of the National Medicines Agency, approved with changes and completions through Law No. 594/2002, with further changes and completions,

on seeing Approval Report of the General Pharmaceutical and Medical Devices Directorate No. E.N. 2.144 din 17 July 2006,

based on Government Decision No. 862/2006 on organisation and functioning of the Ministry of Public Health,

## the minister of public health hereby issues the following order:

Article 1. - Approval of Norms relating to the colouring matters which may be added to medicinal products for human use, provided in the Annex which is integral part of this order.

Article 2. - Provisions of this order come into force on 28 July 2006, at which date all contrary provisions shall be repealed.

Article 3. - The present order is to be published in the Official Gazette of Romania, Part I.

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The present order is a transposition of Council Directive 78/25/EEC din 12 December 1977 on the approximation of the laws of the Member States relating to the colouring matters which may be added to medicinal products, published in the Official Journal of European Communities no. L 11 of 14 January 1978, with further changes and completions.

### **NORMS**

## relating to the colouring matters which may be added to medicinal products for human use

- Article 1. (1) The only colouring matters authorised in Romania for the colouring of medicinal products for human use as defined in Law No. 95/2006 on healthcare reform, Title XVII, The medicinal product, are as covered by the Annex which is integral part of these norms.
- (2) No distinction shall be made between colouring matter for both mass and surface colouring and colouring matter for surface colouring only.
- Article 2. Colouring matters covered by the Annex must satisfy all specific criteria of purity laid down in Annex XV of Norms concerning the colouring matters authorised for use in foodstuffs intended for human use, approved through Order of the minister of public health and the family and the minister of agriculture, food and forestry No. 438/295/2002, with further changes and completions.
- Article 3. The methods of analysis needed to verify that the specific criteria of purity pursuant to the Norms approved through Order of the minister of public health and the family and the minister of agriculture, food and forestry No. 438/295/2002, with further changes and completions, also applies to use of respective colouring matters for colouring medicinal products for human use.
